No-New-Revenue Maintenance and Operations Rate Adjustments

State Criminal Justice Mandate (counties)

The McCulloch County Auditor certifies that McCulloch County has spent \$ 81,230.20 in the previous 12 months for the maintenance and operations cost of keeping inmates sentenced to the Texas Department of Criminal Justice. McCulloch County Sheriff has provided McCulloch information on these costs, minus the state revenues received for the reimbursement of such costs.

This increased the no-new-revenue maintenance and operations rate by 0 /\$100.

Indigent Health Care Compensation Expenditures (counties)

The McCulloch County spent \$ 0 from July 1 2025 to June 30 2026 on indigent health care compensation procedures at the increased minimum eligibility standards, less the amount of state assistance.

For current tax year, the amount of increase above last year's enhanced indigent health care expenditures is \$ 0

This increased the no-new-revenue maintenance and operations rate by 0 /\$100.

Indigent Defense Compensation Expenditures (counties)

The McCulloch County spent \$ 81,400.28 from July 1 2025 to June 30 2026 to provide appointed counsel for indigent individuals in criminal or civil proceedings in accordance with the schedule of fees adopted under Article 26.05, Code of Criminal Procedure, and to fund the operations of a public defender's office under Article 26.044, Code of Criminal Procedure, less the amount of any state grants received. For current tax year, the amount of increase above last year's enhanced indigent defense compensation expenditures is \$ 0

This increased the no-new-revenue maintenance and operations rate by 0 /\$100.

Eligible County Hospital Expenditures (cities and counties)

The McCulloch County spent \$ 0 from July 1 2025 to June 30 2026 on expenditures to maintain and operate an eligible county hospital.
