

Extension of Declaration of Local Disaster For Public Health and Safety

McCulloch County Commissioner's Court Order

WHEREAS, on July 8, 2025, the McCulloch County Judge issued a proclamation declaring a state of disaster for McCulloch County because of severe damage, injury or loss of life or property in relation to the flooding event that began on July 4, 2025 resulting in damages to houses, business's, government buildings, fences, city streets and county roads within McCulloch County; and

WHEREAS, due to the above-described damages, the extensive repair process, combined with the forecast of additional rains, our County is facing a serious threat from extremely dangerous, flooding conditions for our citizens, strained first responder capabilities; and

WHEREAS, the McCulloch County Judge has determined that extraordinary measures must be taken to alleviate the suffering of people and to protect or rehabilitate property and livestock;


WHEREAS, the conditions necessitating declaration of a state of disaster continue to exist; and

WHEREAS, §418.108(b) of the Texas Government Code provides that a local state of disaster may not be continued for a period of excess of seven days without the consent of the governing body of the political subdivision;


NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE MCCULLOCH COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT:

1. That the state of disaster proclaimed for the by the County Judge on July 8, 2025 shall continue until terminated by order of the McCulloch County Commissioners Court.
2. This ordinance is passed as an emergency measure and pursuant to [The Texas Local Government Code] and shall become effective on the 14th day of July, 2025.


Commissioner Precinct 2
